When it comes to a new year, do you tend to look back on what happened the year before or look ahead to the things that are going to come? Maybe a little bit of both?

I think I am generally a look ahead guy. Maybe it is because the sporadic way that my brain works doesn't lend itself to any good end of year data. It is all sort of just jumbled into one big pile of "stuff Shane tried for a bit." But I think that a new year is a great time to look ahead to what is coming.

That's one of the cool things about being a follower of Jesus is how much it is looking ahead. We remember who we were and we remember what was done for us, but ultimately what matters isn't what we were last year or even yesterday, what matters is who we are becoming, how we are growing. Jesus calls to us to continually grow. We are to grow in our knowledge of Him and grow to be more like Him.

Paul said it like this:

Philippians 3:12–14 (CSB)

<sup>12</sup> Not that I have already reached the goal or am already perfect, but I make every effort to take hold of it because I also have been taken hold of by Christ Jesus. <sup>13</sup> Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and reaching forward to what is ahead, <sup>14</sup> I pursue as my goal the prize promised by God's heavenly call in Christ Jesus.

That is how we are to live, as those who are forgetting what is behind and reaching for what is head. We are to pursue the heavenly call. We are to put our eyes forward and pursue Jesus. This isn't always an easy thing to do. In fact, it is often a hard thing to do. There are things that pull our eyes back to our past.

Sometimes it is our pain that pulls us back. We have been hurt and we can't seem to shake that pain. We feel like it is an anchor that holds us back, a stake driven into our heart pinning us into the past. But we don't have to stay there. We don't have to live trapped by our pain. Jesus is offering us hope. He is offering healing. Turning our eyes from our suffering to our savior isn't easy, but if we can do that we can take those first steps toward healing.

Sometimes it is our traditions that hold us in the past. We remember how we did it before and think that is how it should always be. The world is changing and we find ourselves longing for what it was when we were younger. But time doesn't move backward. We can't get trapped in things that happened yesterday and forget that there is life happening today.

Sometimes it is our sin that keeps us trapped in the past. We feel like all of the things that we have done are a weight that holds us back. Maybe there are people in your life who are also using your sin to hold you in place. But that is what is so amazing about Jesus. He offers us freedom! He offers us forgiveness! He offers us grace!

So this year as you move into a new one, remember to look ahead and keep striving toward being more like Jesus. Let Him set you free from those things that are holding you in the past and reach out to be more like him every day.
