Billy Collins former *Poet Laureate of the United States* published this poem about teaching poetry in 1996. I found it a few years later, but it has stuck with me ever since.

Introduction to Poetry*

I ask them to take a poem and hold it up to the light like a color slide or press an ear against its hive.

I say drop a mouse into a poem and watch him probe his way out, or walk inside the poem's room and feel the walls for a light switch.

I want them to waterski across the surface of a poem waving at the author's name on the shore.

But all they want to do is tie the poem to a chair with rope and torture a confession out of it.

They begin beating it with a hose to find out what it really means.


What stands out to me about this bit of poetry is that it also speaks to how we often approach the Bible. We come to the Bible looking for wisdom, for instruction, for a nugget of truth. We come to the Bible looking for what it means. All of those are good reasons to read the Bible, and they are all vital to growing as a Christian.

But if we are always approaching the Bible as an academic endeavor, looking for proof texts and trivia then we are seeing the minutia while missing the message. The Bible is God's story, it is a grand narrative that reveals God's heart and plan for our world. It shows God's love, God's power, God's mercy, God's Justice, God's goodness, and God's deep desire to be known by us.

The Bible shows us how to live and is the foundation for what is right and what is wrong, but it isn't just an instruction manual. It isn't just a textbook. It is God revealing himself to His creation. It is God speaking directly to us. That is why we read it. Because it shows us God. So as you read, don't simply think look for new instructions, spend time looking for the author who created the text for you. He is revealing himself and he will be found if we look for him.



Frances Havergal (1836-1879) was an unusual woman. The daughter of a minister, she mastered Greek and Hebrew to read the scriptures in their original languages. Having grown up in England, she traveled in Europe and enjoyed skiing in the Swiss Alps — an unusual recreation in the nineteenth century. She was also an accomplished singer who sometimes sang with the Philharmonic.

Havergal was a Christian all her life, but at age 36 experienced what we might describe as a conversion experience. A little book entitled *All for Jesus* made her aware of the incompleteness of her own devotion, and she rededicated her life to Christ.

Soon thereafter, she spent five days with a small group of people, some of whom were not Christians, and others of whom were lukewarm. She spent those five days witnessing to them and praying for them, and was delighted to see her prayers answered. By the end of that week, all ten people had devoted themselves to Christ. That night, too excited to sleep, Havergal sat up writing this hymn, "Take My Life and Let It Be" based off of Leviticus 11:44.

Take my life, and let it be; Consecrated, Lord, to Thee; Take my moments and my days, Let them flow in ceaseless praise. Let them flow in ceaseless praise.

Take my hands, and let them move; At the impulse of Thy love; Take my feet, and let them be; Swift and beautiful for Thee. Swift and beautiful for Thee.

Take my voice, and let me sing; Always, only, for my King; Take my lips, and let them be; Filled with messages from Thee. Filled with messages from Thee.

Take my silver and my gold: Not a mite would I withhold; Take my intellect, and use; Ev'ry pow'r as Thou shalt choose. Ev'ry pow'r as Thou shalt choose.

Take my will, and make it Thine, It shall be no longer mine; Take my heart, it is Thine own, It shall be Thy royal throne. It shall be Thy royal throne.

Take my love, my Lord, I pour; At Thy feet its treasure store; Take myself, and I will be, Ever, only, all for Thee. Ever, only, all for Thee.
