

"In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, lofty and exalted, with the train of His robe filling the temple. Seraphim stood above Him, each having six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one called out to another and said,

'Holy, Holy, Holy, is the Lord of hosts, the whole earth is full of His glory." (Isaiah 6:1-3)

During the days of Isaiah, a King named Uzziah reigned and brought Judah to great power and prominence. However, Uzziah became proud, and God struck this proud King with leprosy. On the day the King died, Isaiah 6 records that Isaiah had a vision of God.

In this vision, the Lord is revealed to be a great king, sitting on a throne. The text says that "Seraphim stood above Him..." Seraphim are angelic beings whose unique task is to worship and praise God. Their name "seraphim" comes from the word "seraph," which means "to burn." The seraphim lived in the center of the fire of God's glory, and they burned and shone with white-hot heated praise!

Each of the seraphim had six wings. With two, they covered their faces because they couldn't bear to look on the face of the Lord, and with two, they covered their feet because they were unworthy to be in His presence. Although they had been before God for thousands of years, they still covered their faces and hid their feet in shame.

Piercing the stillness around the throne, you would have heard the cry of seraphim tongues calling out one word back and forth to one another. "Holv. Holv. Holv is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory." What does it mean that God is holy? The root from which this word comes from means "to separate or cut off." This implies the idea of God's separateness from us and all impurity.

So how can an unholy man approach a holy God? The only answer is Jesus. The Bible teaches that we are made alive "in Christ" by grace through faith in Him. In Christ, we can approach God because we have a perfect sacrifice for sins and perfect righteousness. Without Jesus, we have no hope. But with Jesus, we can come boldly into His presence!

God is good! All the time!

As school starts back for elementary, middle, Ministry high school, and college students and teachers, keep them in the forefront of your prayer list. They will face many challenges but they will also have a wonderful

opportunity to share Jesus at school. Pray for the opportunities to share Christ and that their life would be a mirror that would reflect Jesus.

Often in our faith journey we are quick to give "Sunday School" answers to questions that need deeper reflection. My awakening to such thinking was most vivid in 2003 when I lost both parents: my dad in March and my mom in November. During times of loss, or upheavals in our life, our faith is tested. We end up either holding tighter or letting go. Thank God that the working out of our faith in those desperate times ultimately depends upon His Sovereignty, not our sufficiency to handle things or make sense of it all.

During the hazardous junctures of our existence our true character is revealed. But even more importantly than our character, the sufficiency of Christ to walk with us through these problematic, often gut-wrenching events, materializes. His strong arms hold tightly and carry us through the storm. I imagine many of you have felt exactly what I am talking about.

The words to this modern hymn "He Will Hold Me Fast" were originally written by: Ada Ruth Habershon. Matthew Merker read the words while going through a period of questioning in his faith journey. Through his struggle and working out of his faith, he emerged stronger. The questions were not too big for God. The resultant words of the hymn are powerful and comforting.

> When I fear my faith will fail, Christ will hold me fast. When the tempter would prevail, He will hold me fast. I could never keep my hope through life's fearful path, For my love is often cold, He must hold me fast.

He will hold me fast. He will hold me fast. For my Savior loves me so, He will hold me fast.

Those He saves are His delight, Christ will hold me fast. Precious in His Holy sight, He will hold me fast. He'll not let my soul be lost, His promises shall last; Bought by Him at such a cost, He will hold me fast.

For my life He bled and died, Christ will hold me fast. Justice has been satisfied: He will hold me fast. Raised with Him to endless life. He will hold me fast: 'Till my faith is turned to sight when He comes at last.

He will hold me fast. He will hold me fast. For my Savior loves me so, He will hold me fast.

Merker discovered, as countless before him, it is God who does the saving. Our salvation is secure in Him. Our destiny is sure. The path may be filled with dense fog, hailstorms, tornadic explosions, unexplained happenings that shake us to our knees. Yet...if we are Christ's child. HE will hold us fast!
