Summer is amazing. It is full of slower days filled with sunlight and laughter and memories.

Summer is awful. It is a sweaty slog through hot days and bored kids and guilt over not making the most of the time.

Which of these statements more closely lines up with your idea of summer? Depending on the day I find myself feeling both of them, sometimes both at the exact same time. Every year it seems like I have forgotten what 90 degrees and humid feels like. Every year I feel like I want to use the time to do fun things, or fix things, or learn things, but those things never seem to work out.

I understand that summer feels like it should be magical, but often ends up feeling like one more bit of stress or reasons for feeling like you are falling behind. So I don't want you to feel like this is one more list of things that you aren't doing right, but here are three things that might help you turn summer from that time when your clothes get wet just walking to the car, into something worth remembering.

Embracing the Gift of Time

Summer offers a rare gift: time. Ecclesiastes 3:1 reminds us, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." The season of summer offers more time for getting outside and spending time with the people that you love.

Challenge: Even when you are tired from a long day at work, commit to taking one afternoon/evening a week to spend time with your family outside.

Caveat: DO NOT beat yourself up if this is hard some weeks. No one is perfect, and making spending time a chore is a sure way of making sure you don't do it. So give yourself grace.

Building Stronger Bonds

One of the key benefits of spending time together as a family is the strengthening of relationships. Activities like family picnics, hiking trips, or simply enjoying a meal together can create lasting memories and deepen the emotional bonds between family members.

Challenge: Get outside of the house and do something together. I have very few memories of my parents that were sitting around inside our house. Most of them happened outside the home.

Caveat: If you have teenagers, just embrace the whining and make them go anyway. You make them go to school, and time with their family is just as important.

Cultivating Faith Through Shared Experiences

Incorporating faith-based activities into your family's summer can be both enriching and bonding. Whether it's a family Bible study, attending church services together, or volunteering for community service, these shared experiences can reinforce spiritual growth and togetherness. Deuteronomy 6:6-7 says. "These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."

Challenge: Commit now to making sure your family is in church this summer. Look for other ways that you can engage in faith based activities with them.


Caveat: Don't forget to talk about God stuff just in the regular times of your day too. Following God isn't an event; it is a lifestyle.



"The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: A broken and a contrite heart, God, You will not despise." (Psalm 51:17)

I am fascinated by the many different ways that people around the world worship the one true God. Depending on the person or the place, we all have our own ways and practices. I read recently about an interesting practice in another country. As the people entered the sanctuary to worship, they immediately knelt and prayed, facing away from the front of the church. The practice in this culture is to personally confess sin to God before the worship service even begins.

I believe this act of humility is a picture of what David said in Psalm 51:17, "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and a contrite heart, God, You will not despise." David was describing his own remorse and repentance for his sin of adultery with Bathsheba. Real sorrow for sin involves adopting God's view of what we have done. It involves seeing our disobedience as clearly wrong. disliking it, and not wanting it to continue.

When we are truly broken over our sin, God lovingly puts us back together. 1 John 1:9 promises, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous, so that He will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." God's forgiveness produces a fresh sense of openness with Him and it is the ideal starting point for our worship and praise. After David repented, confessed, and was forgiven by God, he responded in Psalm 51:15, by saying, "Lord, open my lips, so that my mouth may declare Your praise."

Humility is the correct response to God's holiness - and praise is the correct response to God's forgiveness. As we gather to worship, it is necessary for us to confess our sin and to cling to God for His mercy and forgiveness. The Bible clearly reveals how God will respond to our brokenness. In Psalm 103:8, the psalmist explains, "The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in mercy."

God is good! All the time!
