Fear is a liar. Fear is a thief. Fear is a razor wire fence. Fear is a bestseller.

The Bible speaks about fear over 300 times. It is a topic that comes up over and over again. In Deuteronomy God tells the people not to be afraid. He tells Joshua to be strong and courageous. Psalm after psalm reminds us to trust in God so that we do not have to fear. In John, Jesus tells his followers to have peace and not let their hearts be troubled.

God is constantly, all throughout the Bible, reminding his people to not be

I think this is because we are all, as a people, prone to fear. It is human nature to be afraid. Not only that there are lots of scary things out there and there are lots of good reasons to be afraid. And yet God in the middle of all of that speaks peace to our hearts.

John 14:27 (CSB)

"Peace I leave with you. My peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Don't let your heart be troubled or fearful."

God is walking with us. We do not have to be afraid. But trusting in God is hard for all of us, and Christians are no exception to that. So here are some things about fear that I think are helpful to remember.

Fear is a Liar.

It will make things look worse than they are. It will make you feel smaller than you are. It will tell you that you are alone, that no one cares, that it is all up to you. Fear is a liar that keeps the truth of God from you.

Fear is a Thief.

It will steal your joy, steal your hope, steal your peace. Fear wants to make you anxious, wants to set you on edge. It will steal your peace. It will also steal your joy. It wants to keep you afraid forever, so it steals all other emotions.

Fear is a Razor Wire Fence.

It keeps people out and away. Christianity is about welcoming people in. It is who we are. We are made to open our hearts and doors to others. We are made to invite people into fellowship with us. Fear keeps people away. Fear chases off everyone, especially people who aren't like us. Fear keeps us isolated and alone.

Fear is a Bestseller.


This is probably the most dangerous part of fear. Fear is easy to sell. Fear is easy to pass on. It is orders of magnitude easier to get a group of people to follow you if you make them afraid rather than if you inspire them to greatness. Fear sells, and right now it seems like everyone is selling it.

Right now in a world that seems like there is so much to be afraid of let us as Christians be the ones who remember the words of Isaiah. Isaiah 43:1b (CSB)

"Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;

I have called you by your name; you are mine.



"All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will certainly not cast out."

She was an embittered woman, Charlotte Elliott of Brighton, England. Her health was broken, and her disability had hardened her heart. "If God loved me," she muttered, "He would not have treated me this way." Hoping to help her, a Swiss minister, Dr. Cesar Malan, visited the Elliotts on May 9, 1822. Over dinner, Charlotte lost her temper and railed against God and family in a violent outburst. Her embarrassed family left the room, and Dr. Malan and Charlotte were left alone. "You are tired of yourself, aren't you?" Dr. Malan asked. "You are holding on to your hate and anger because you have nothing else in the world to cling to. Consequently, you have become sour, bitter, and resentful." "What's your cure?" asked Charlotte. "The very faith you are trying to despise." As they talked Charlotte softened and finally asked, "What would I do?" Dr. Malan replied, "You would give yourself to God just as you are now, with your fightings and fears, hates and loves, pride and shame." Charlotte replied, "I would come to God just as I am? Charlotte did come to Jesus just as she was, and her heart was changed that day. As time passed Charlotte claimed John 6:37 as a special verse for her "... he who comes to Me I will be no means cast out." A few years later Charlotte penned the poem "Him That Cometh To Me I Will No Wise Cast Out." That poem has become one of the most famous invitation songs in church history: "Just As I Am"

"Just as I am without one plea,
But that Thy blood was shed for me,
And that Thou bidst me come to Thee,
O Lamb of God, I come, I come.
Just as I am though tossed about,
With many a conflict, many a doubt,
Fightings and fears within, without,
O Lamb of God, I come, I come."
